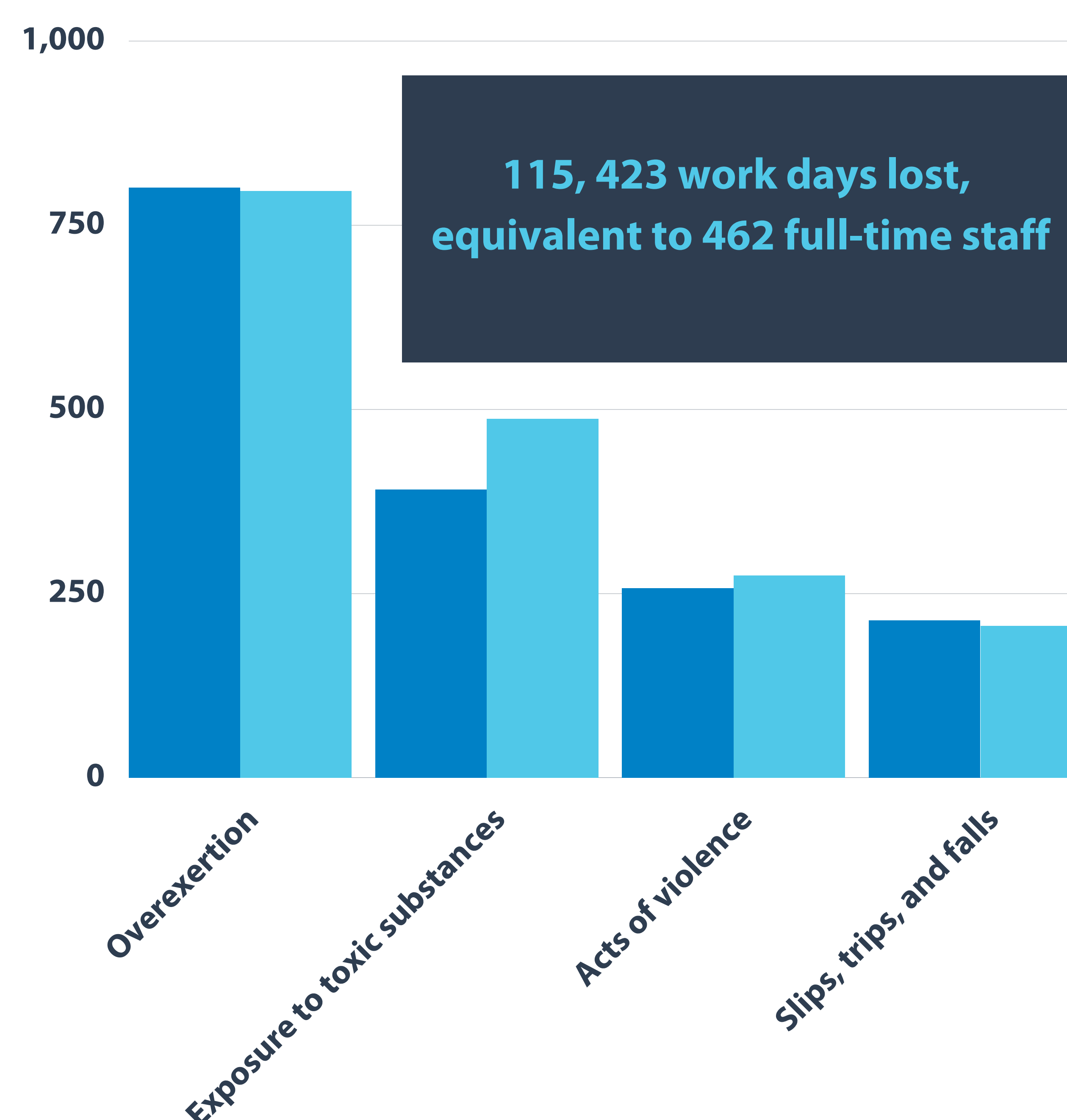




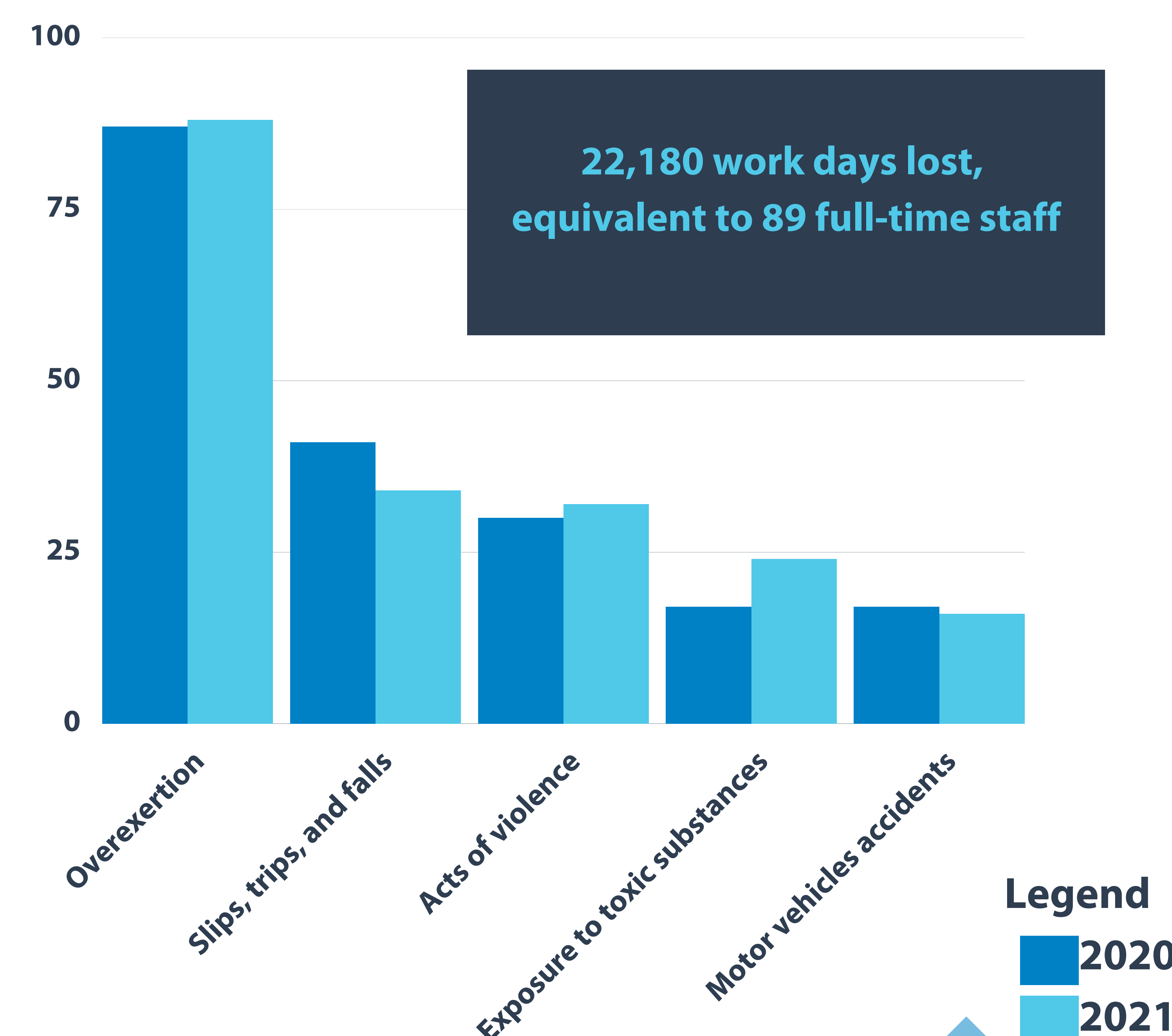
Quality staff provide quality care

- Meeting templates and resources.

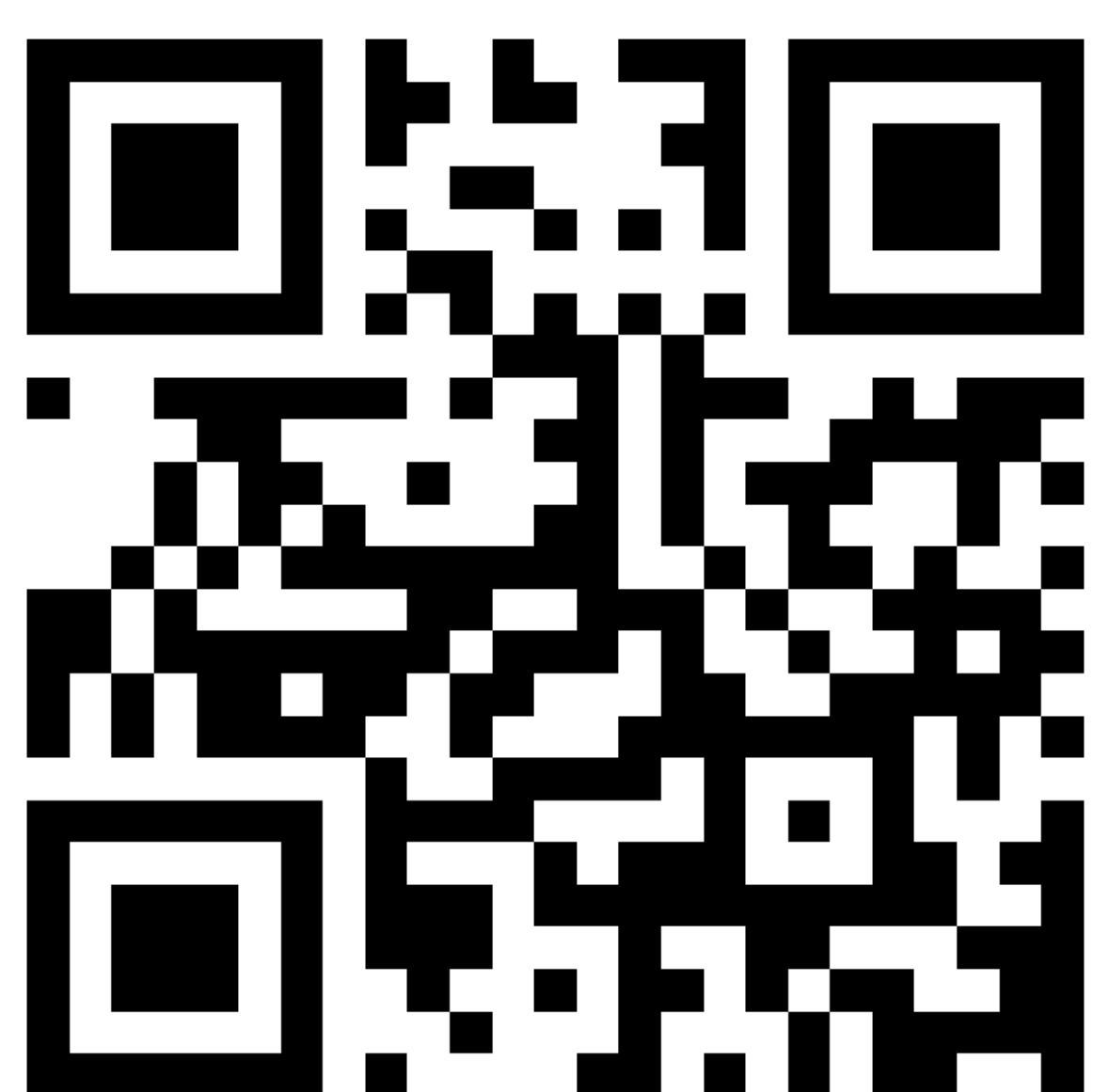
